REGULATIONS

Each and every concession will be responsible for the disposal of their own garbage, and for the neat appearance of their concession. Space must be left clean of rubbish and refuse at close of fair. Space contract will be cancelled if this regulation is not complied with.

No toy guns of any type or fireworks may be sold. Bean shooters, or other dangerous merchandise, will *NOT* be sold on the grounds, nor will they be permitted to be used on the grounds.

CAMPERS

\$20.00 a night for electricity. You must have 2 paid passes - exhibitor's or season. Campers must pre-register to reserve a spot.

ELECTRIC LIGHT AND POWER

A minimum charge of \$40 will be made for connecting electricity to concessions. This will entitle concessionaire to maximum power of 20 amp. at 117 V.A.C. to stand or tent. Additional requirements will be supplied at additional charge.

Availability of power at any location should be first checked with the Fair electrician and is subject to the Fair electrician's approval.



General Rules and Regulations

Notice: Premiums will be paid at the Office of the Secretary on the Fairgrounds. Premiums must be called for at the office as they *WILL NOT* be mailed out. Checks must be cashed within 60 days - no exceptions.

- 1. All livestock and home ec exhibitors must preenter. This rule does not apply to tractor pull or horse, rabbit and poultry shows. (These will remain one day shows as in the past, with the entries to be made on show day.)
- 2. All entries must be postmarked on or before *June 8, 2020*. The Ford County Fair cannot be responsible for the U.S. Postal Service misplacing or detaining your entry. Metered mail postmarks will not be honored.
- Entry blanks must be filled in completely. The social security number is especially important as entries cannot be made and checks cannot be issued without it.
- 4. All *entry fees must* accompany the entry blanks. If the fees are not paid by *June 8*, the deadline date, the entries will be returned to the exhibitor. *NO REFUNDS*.
- No changes will be made in the judge's book. The
 only errors to be corrected will be those made by
 the office staff. Superintendents should check with
 the office if an exhibitor feels an error has been
 made.
- A charge of \$75.00 will be made for all checks ISF.
 If you lose your premium check and want a new check issued, you will be charged for the bank's "Stop Payment" fee.
- 7. Livestock exhibitors desiring to use a portable generator during the fair must meet the rules set forth by the State Fire Marshall and the Fair Board. No generators will be permitted without first registering it with the fair secretary and securing a permit. Only 1 fan per 3 animals allowed.

Notice: Official entry blanks must be in the hands of Jane Meyer, 1795N 1800E Rd., Thawville, IL 60968 or postmarked prior to midnight Monday, June 8, 2020, or entries will not be accepted. Metered mail postmarks will not be honored. Entries may be made at the secretary's office at the fairgrounds between Noon and 4:00 p.m. on Monday, June 8, 2020. Exhibitor's fees and requests for number of stalls and pens must accompany entry blanks or entry will not be accepted.

- 8. All exhibits will remain the property of exhibitor.
- 9. No person will be allowed more than one entry in the same premium number except in livestock.
- All exhibits of grain, fruit, and vegetables must have been produced during the current growing season.
- 11. Judging will take place at the time specified by the head of each department. Exhibitors will cooperate with the judges in order that judging may be carried through without delay. Entry tag must be on exhibit or exhibition while it is being judged.
- 12. Hogs will be released Monday after the show.

- **Sheep** will be released Thursday after checks are distributed. **Cattle** will be released Thursday after the open show. Jr. Rabbits will be released at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday. Livestock may not be released to go to another fair.
- 13. When bringing livestock exhibits to the fair, report to the Superintendent of entries at the Secretary's office. Household and Horticulture exhibits will be received at the Home Ec Building.
- 14. The Superintendent of each department shall have the arrangement and supervision of all articles or animals on exhibition in his department. Entry cards on livestock must be received before animals are unloaded and penned. All entry cards on livestock will be received from the secretary at the fairgrounds.
- 15. The Superintendent shall record all entries with the name of exhibitors, class and lot of entry, record winners and affix the ribbons. He also has the authority to examine registration papers of pedigreed animals.
- 16. Superintendents will be particular to observe the colors in designating awards: Champion-Royal Purple; First-Blue; Second-Red; Third-White; Fourth-Pink; Fifth-Yellow; Sixth-Green; Seventh-Light Green.
- 17. The management will in no case be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits. Watchmen will be on duty each day and night of the fair.
- 18. The decision of the judges will be final and no appeal will be considered. Exhibits may be barred from competition for trying to influence of finding fault with the judges' decision.
- 19. The interpretation of all rules governing any exhibit shall rest entirely with the Fair Association and their decision shall be final.
- 20. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judges during their judging will be promptly excluded from competition.
- 21. Trucks and cars entering the grounds for the purpose of delivering merchandise will be required to buy a season ticket. *Deliveries are to be made before noon each day.*
- 22. Care will be exercised to prevent accident or damage of every kind, but the management will not assume any liability for damage to property or person.
- 23. No dogs will be allowed on the fairgrounds with the exception of the 4-H Dog Show and those must be on a leash.
- 24. Neither the Secretary or any Officer of the Fair shall disclose to competitors or any other person, what entries have been made, nor shall any other person, other than the Secretary and Officers of the Fair, be allowed to know what other entries have been made before entries close.
- 25. Registration papers are required for all purebred animals. Junior livestock exhibitors must provide proof of ownership for the purebreds.


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


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

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RULES REGARDING LIVESTOCK

All Health Certificates must be presented and checked before any livestock is unloaded.

Entries will not be changed after entry deadline.

- Make entries early by filling in blanks and mailing to Jane Meyer, 1795N 1800E Rd., Thawville, Illinois 60968 prior to midnight, Monday, June 8, 2020. Livestock entries not received by above date will not be accepted. Metered Mail postmarks will not be honored.
- LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS MUST BE ON THE FAIRGROUNDS BY THESE TIMES: Cattle 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, June 16; Hogs 2:00 p.m. Sunday, June 14 (weigh-in 2:00 4:00 p.m.); Jr. Rabbits Noon, Monday, June 15; Sheep 9:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 17.
- 3. Every livestock exhibitor will be required to buy an exhibitor's season ticket at \$10.00. A charge will be made for each stall and pen. See official entry blank for amounts.
- 4. Exhibitor's fees and requests for number of stalls and pens must accompany entry blank.
- All Livestock Exhibitors need to check in at the Fair Secretary's office upon arrival. Beef and Swine exhibitors pick up parking passes and exhibitor tickets on Sunday, Monday or Tuesday at the office.
- 6. Awards will be made by the single judge system unless the superintendent decides more are required.
- 7. Where there is no competition and the exhibit is worthy, the first prize only is awarded.
- 8. All money must accompany entries or they will not be accepted. No refunds.
- 9. All livestock will be inspected before being

- housed. Whitman Veterinary Clinic will provide the veterinarian in charge of the livestock at the fair and all livestock will be under their supervision at all times.
- 10. Everyone must furnish their own watering utensils as there will be no public troughs.
- 11. Livestock exhibitors must furnish their own feed.
- 12. Help for unloading and penning the livestock will be furnished by the Fair Association.
- 13. Champion: Only animals awarded first prize in class rings are eligible to compete for best animal.
- 14. No protests considered unless presented in writing to the Fair secretary.
- 15. Definition: "Official Health Certificate: as referred to in these regulations shall be one issued and signed by an approved, accredited veterinarian or a veterinarian of the Bureau of Animal Industry.
- 16. Two entries per exhibitor allowed in livestock in each premium number in Open and Junior Show.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR'S NOTICE

The truck gate at the north side of the grounds will be used for bringing in livestock the first day. Deliveries of supplies for the livestock must be made each day before noon, and the truck gate will be used for that purpose.

2020 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements County Fairs

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

- 1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits.
 - All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php
- All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request.
 - CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.
- 3. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.
- 4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
- 5. CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
- 6. CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
- 7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon

entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise.

Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

- 8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. New examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit.
 - The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.
- 9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited. Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.
- 10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

Brucellosis

- Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twentyfour (24) months of age.
 - C. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified).
 - D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
- 2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

Tuberculosis

- 1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
- Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibition.
 - C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

Illinois Swine

Identification

- 1. Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
- Ear notch identification is acceptable for barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine. (Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)

Brucellosis

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Pseudorabies

Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Out-of-State Swine

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

Identification

- 1. Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
- Ear notch identification <u>is not</u> acceptable for crossbred animals.

Brucellosis

- 1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
- Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

Pseudorabies

- 1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
- Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
- 3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
- Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Market Lambs

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

Illinois Sheep

- Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Sheep

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

Illinois Goats

1. Goats originating from a herd that has

- previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
- 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Goats

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
- 2. Tuberculosis- Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

Illinois Equine

- 1. All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
- 4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

Out-of-State Equine

All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- 1. All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- 3. All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

POULTRY

- 1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
- Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
- 3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
- 4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds.
- 5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.
- 6. A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. A permit may be obtained by calling (217) 782-4944.

Please note: These poultry exhibition requirements do not apply to 4-H and FFA 1-day poultry shows where the entries are taken to the show and returned home the same day. However, a permit is required for out-of-state poultry.

CERVIDAE

(Deer, Elk, Reindeer, Caribou, Moose, Red Deer and other Related Species)

Identification

All animals shall be individually identified with an approved tag, microchip or tattoo. Elk are required to have two official/approved unique identifiers.

Illinois Cervidae

Chronic Wasting Disease

For cervidae changing ownership or moving within the State, the owner must obtain a permit issued by the Department prior to movement and the cervid must originate from a herd that is enrolled in the Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program or the Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Program. The permit shall be obtained no more than 72 hours in advance of the movement of the cervids by providing the following information:

- A) Name and complete mailing address of person exhibiting the cervids;
- B) Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease or Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Herd number;
- C) Name and complete mailing address of location where the animals will be exhibited;
- Number of animals and unique identification of the animals.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin test is not required for Illinois cervidae.

Out-of-State Cervidae

Chronic Wasting Disease

- 1. All cervidae entering Illinois must be in compliance with the Illinois Wildlife Code [520 ILCS 5]. For more information, contact the Illinois Department of Natural Resources at 217/782-6384.
- 2. All cervidae entering Illinois must be accompanied by a permit from the Department and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that:
 - has been issued by an accredited veterinarian of the state of origin or a veterinarian in the employ of the United States Department of Agriculture;
 - b. is approved by the Animal Health Official of the state of origin;

- c. shows that the cervidae are free from visible evidence of any contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto, do not originate from a CWD endemic area (any county and surrounding counties where CWD has been diagnosed in the past five years);
- shows that the cervidae are not originating from a herd under quarantine for any contagious, infectious or communicable disease:
- e. shows that the animals originate from a herd that has been monitored for at least
 5 years under a state-approved CWD certification program.
- 3. A permit number can be obtained by calling (217) 782-4944. Applicant for permit shall furnish the following information to the Department:
 - Name and post office mailing address of Illinois destination;
 - b. Name and post office mailing address of the consignor and/or source herds;
 - Name and post office mailing address of the herd veterinarian;
 - d. Number and unique identification of cervidae in shipment.

Brucellosis

Cervidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative brucellosis card or PCFIA test within sixty (60) days prior to entry.

Tuberculosis

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States

All cervidae twelve (12) months of age and over shall be negative to two (2) single cervical test for bovine TB no less than ninety (90) days apart with the second test conducted within ninety (90) days prior to entry. These animals shall be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period unless they originate from an accredited, qualified or monitored herd.

- A. Cervidae from an accredited herd may be moved into Illinois without further TB testing provided that a certificate stating that such cervids originated from an accredited herd accompanies them.
- B. Cervidae originating from qualified or monitored herds may enter with a negative test within ninety (90) days prior to entry and a certificate stating that the animals originate from a monitored herd.
- Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)

- A. All cervidae shall originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
- B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to two (2) additional tuberculin tests conducted within 180 and 30 days prior to entry or exhibition.

RATITES

(Ostriches, Emus, Rheas, Cassowaries and Kiwis) Illinois Ratites

There are no requirements governing the movement of ratites within Illinois.

Out-of-State Ratites

- 1. Must be accompanied by a CVI and permit number. Entry permits are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944.
- 2. Individually identified by leg band or microchip.
- 3. Negative test for Avian Influenza within 10 days prior to entry.

PIGEONS

There are no requirements governing the movements of pigeons within or into Illinois.

RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

LLAMAS

There are no requirements governing the movement of llamas within Illinois. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state llamas. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217) 782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

Ford County Fair Talent Contest Show Rules

The Ford County Fair will be hosting a talent show at the Fair dance building in Melvin, IL, on Wednesday, June 17, 2020 @ 6:30 pm. There will be two age divisions, and the winner of each division will represent Ford County in Springfield at the Illinois Association of Agricultural Fairs Convention in January, 2021. The Ford County Fair will pay the \$75 entry fee to sponsor the winners of this competition.

Rules of the Contest:

(IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE RULES, PAY SPECIAL ATTENTION TO RULES 1, 4 & 5, THEY HAVE CHANGED.)

- 1. The contest is open to anyone 21 years of age or younger. You do not have to live in Ford County to participate, but must be a resident of Illinois and agree to represent Ford County if you are a winner in this county's talent contest. A professional entertainer is someone who has a lot of experience or skill in a particular job or activity. For this contest you may not participate if you have been paid fees for performing in your area of talent. Example: A dancer who has been paid may enter as a singer. The dancer may not enter as a dance contestant. Engaged in a specified activity as one's paid occupation rather than as a pastime.
- Junior Division contestants must be 14 years of age or under by June 17, 2020. Senior division contestants must be between 14 and 21 years of age by June 17, 2020.
- 3. A person can enter in only one event. They may not enter in a solo and duet in the same age division.
- 4. Age limits each division:
 - a. Junior Division: All contestants can be 14 years old or younger on the day and date of the local contest. Junior division contestants can be 15 years old when competing at the State Level in January, if they met the age requirements at their local contest.
 - b. Senior Division: Contestants cannot be over 21 years of age on the day and date of their local contest. Senior division contestants can be 22 years old when competing at the State Level in January, if they met the age requirements at their local contest.
- 5. New update: All competitors that have previously competed at the state level are now eligible to perform at the local level and if they win they may perform at the state competition.
- 6. The second place act may represent Ford County at State in the event the winner cannot compete.
- There will be a panel of judges, and their decision will be final. Interpretation of the rules will be determined by the talent show committee.
- 8. Each act will be judged in the following four categories. A perfect score is 100.

Costume = 10 points Stage Presentation = 30 points Audience Contact = 10 points Ability = 50 points

- 9. Any act that goes over the four minute performance time limit will be disqualified.
- 10. No voices, synthesized voices of vocal utterances are allowed on any taped accompaniment used by any vocal act. No taps or tap effects are allowed on a tapped recording used by a dancer. In an instrumental solo, the accompaniment allowed is a live or taped acoustical piano. In piano solos, no accompaniment allowed. In the use of electronic keyboard, the contestant must create all sounds live on stage. CD's may be reviewed by the committee or judges to be sure no additional voices, instruments or taps are prerecorded. CD's must be cued ready to perform.
- 11. There will be a piano furnished.
- 12. Winners will win \$40 for third, \$60 for second and \$100 for first. [\$60 at the Fair & \$40 at Springfield competition]
- 13. Registration will be from 5:30 6:00 pm June 17th in the Dance Building. Contestants **must provide a 4 x 6 card** with the act and name of the music, and personal information, parents name, school, and year in school and hobbies.
- 14. Entry deadline is June 2, 2020.
- 15. The entry fee of \$5.00 must be sent with entry form.

GENERAL 4-H RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. See the **Ford County 4-H Show & Policy Guide** for general policies, procedures, and fair entry information. The handbook can be found at the Ford-Iroquois Extension website http://web.extension.illinois.edu/cfiv/iroquois4h/
- 4-Hers may only exhibit projects in which they are properly enrolled in by deadlines set by 4-H
 Extension staff.
- 3. 4-H members who are unable to show their projects at the summer judging shows due to an excused absence should send the completed project with another 4-H member or their leader accompanied by a written summary of the exhibit. These exhibit forms are available from club leaders or the Extension office prior to the fair.
- 4. No projects receiving lower than a "blue" rating will be considered for a champion rating or State Fair selection.
- 5. All projects will remain on display until 12:00 p.m. on Saturday.
- 6. General projects will be released from 12:00–1:00p.m. on Saturday. If you are unable to pick up your projects you may arrange for someone else to get them for you. (Unclaimed projects must be picked up by club leaders.) 4-H members are encouraged to help clean the 4-H Building after projects are released. Any remaining projects will be taken to the Extension office in Onarga.
- 7. Any 4-H member may attend the State Fair and exhibit in one exhibit class in the 4-H Exhibit Division. Members may also participate in the 4-H State Dog Show and 4-H Public Presentation contest.
- 8. 4-H Show fair entry will be done online. Members must register their show entries by June 1.
- 9. Each individual 4-H exhibitor must have personally cared for the animals exhibited.
- 10. The Extension County Director and 4-H Youth Development staff reserve the right to make any additional rules or interpretations deemed necessary for the best interest of the majority of all 4-H members exhibiting.
- 12. Members are paid premiums based on an x-factor based on the availability of funds from the State Ag Premium Fund. For more information about premiums, please refer to the Ford County 4-H Show & Policy Guide.
- 13. All precautions will be taken to protect the exhibits on display during the fair. However, University of Illinois Extension staff or volunteers are not responsible for damage, loss, or injury to any project during the 4-H Show or at the time of release.
- 14. If you need reasonable accommodations in order to participate in the 4-H Show, contact University of Illinois Extension, Ford-Iroquois Extension office by June 10, 2020. (815)268-4051





GENERAL RULES FOR 4-H LIVESTOCK MEMBERS

- 1. Health certificates are required as set forth in the State of Illinois Livestock Exhibition regulations. It is the 4-H member's responsibility to comply with these rules. To exhibit, 4-H members must comply with animal identification procedures for the respective species.
- 2. Health certificates will be collected before the animals will be unloaded at the fairgrounds.
- 3. Purebred breeding stock in all classes must have been registered in the 4-H member's name. Registration papers must be available for inspection. No partnership or family registrations will be accepted.
- 4. All 4-H exhibitors enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats will be required to certify in the YQCA program each year starting for the 2020 show season. Members can either attend a face to face class or certify on-line via the website http://yqca.org The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. This certification is needed each year with test out options of 1-3 years. The course must be completed by June 1, 2020 in order for youth to show at county and/or state livestock shows. Members who do not complete the certification before June 1, 2020 will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show.
- 5. All 4-H youth enrolled in poultry, horses, rabbits, cats, and dogs will be required to complete the Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification online course. The Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification has been developed to review what is expected of youth when preparing for and exhibiting animals in competition. The course can be accessed here: http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/. Members who do not complete the certification before June 1, 2020 will be removed from the project and are not allowed to show. The course only needs to be taken once during a member's 4-H career. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. The Extension office has a list of those who have taken the certification. Members should print out their affidavit and certificates and keep with their 4-H records.
- 6. All animals must be exhibited by the 4-H member or another 4-H member. If a youth is absent from the entire fair and another 4-H member shows his animal for him he will only be eligible to receive a blue, red, or white rating. He will not be eligible to receive any additional ribbons/trophies/awards. Decisions on if the youth can sell his animal at the sale are up to the Livestock Sale Committee and requests will have to be made to them. If the member chooses to arrive on the fairgrounds in time to show his own animal, he will still be eligible to compete for any additional ribbons/trophies/awards. However, the animals must be brought to the fairgrounds at the proper time, weighed in and cared for by another 4-H member or their family until the 4-H member arrives.
- 7. 4-Hers who remove their livestock before the designated release time will not receive a premium check.
- 8. If violations are observed, the animals will be excused from exhibition and possibly be ordered to be removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited as determined by superintendents, fair board, and/or Extension staff. Any practice or deviation from normal humane husbandry practices, including but not limited to artificial manipulations, physical abuse, medical treatments or mechanical applications of any substance, other than on the prescriptions of a licensed veterinarian, will constitute a violation of show rules and are subject to the above provisions.
- 9. In certain situations a 4-H member may be allowed to borrow an animal from another 4-H member for Showmanship. However, they must have prior approval from the superintendent and Ford-Iroquois Extension Staff before the show.
- 10. If you elect not to bring an animal or scratch an entry that you entered on the 4-H Fair Entry website please notify the Extension office.

LIVESTOCK SALE RULES

Livestock Sale Committee - Bryan and Stephanie Cole, Darrell Foster, Bob Wright, Roger Wycoff

- 1. 4-Hers may only sell one market animal in each category. The categories include **large animals**: steer, market heifer, barrow, and **small animals**: rabbits or poultry. (Rabbits market pen or single fryer. Poultry market pen or market bird. Refer to county 4-H Show & Policy Guide for description of market classes.)
- 2. If a member owns both the Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion they may sell both at the sale.
- 3. Members or parents may not bid on their own stock.
- 4. In order to qualify for the sale, the market animal must meet the following minimum weight requirements during weigh-in on show day. Hogs 220 lbs. (maximum weight 300 lbs.), Beef 875 lbs., Poultry and rabbits must be marketable. Superintendents have the right to determine if animals are marketable.
- 5. Sale order will be announced at the sale meeting prior to the fair. Grand and Reserve Champions of each specie will sell first with others following in predetermined order. The sale will be held in the show barn.
- 6. Pictures will be taken of member and buyer(s) after the sale of each animal. All 4-Hers participating in the sale are required to have their picture taken with the buyer(s).
- 7. The committee will retain 5% of the profits for sale expenses.
- 8. All 4-Hers are required to assist with either set up or tear down of the livestock show barn for the sale.
- 9. 4-Hers participating in the sale will encourage attendance of potential buyers from their community.
- 4-Hers selling an animal must attend the 4-H Livestock Sale Meeting that will be held during fair week in their respective barns. TBA on time and day of fair week. 4-H member must be present with a parent. Anyone not having representation at the meeting will be placed at the bottom of the sale order. All 4-Her's must bring their sale card with them to the Sale Meeting. A parent or guardian must sign the sale card.
- 11. 4-H members must be present during the Livestock Auction to sell. No exceptions unless prior clearance from Livestock Committee.
- 12. The sale committee will handle all questions relating to the sale.
